The library is a key membership resource which can be actively utilised at our face to face meetings.


We are expanding it into a centralised resource for more than just books. There is other equipment available to borrow.

Book Review by Lawrence Wadsworth

Callanish The Crown – The Stonehenge of the North – by Gwendolyn Awen Jones



This book answers many questions about stone circles, their purpose and how they are all connected. In essence though, it is about the stone circle at Callanish on the Isle of Lewis in the Outer Hebrides.

Divided into four parts, the first part provides us with a time line putting into context the age of the stone circle.

We learn of its location, and that of other megalithic sites nearby, and how peat partially covered the stones until 1857 when the stones were fully revealed. Previous researches and surveys are mentioned, noting that one researcher had found that many stone circles created precise geometric shapes, so called sacred geometry. Finally we are given detailed solar and lunar alignments of the circle relating to their various phases.

In part 2 the author talks about her inner vision, and we learn of her journey to Mexico where she was taught how to use her special gift and become a natural healer. On her return she studied ancient sacred knowledge, and learnt dowsing. She tells us that we are electromagnetic beings and that the earth is a giant dynamo interacting constantly with us, the sun, the planets and the cosmos. Around the earth are pulsating magnetic lines of force, crossing and forming nodes at sacred sites, where the energy of these ley lines are magnified, especially at the solstices and equinoxes.

It was on a visit to Glastonbury Tor in 1986 that the author was given a clear vision of a web of light radiating out across the land connecting ancient sites which each had an etheric crystal above it radiating at a unique frequency to the site. Some areas of the web were shimmering with light whilst others had become dark, and she saw this was due to the stone circle being damaged or destroyed. Any disruptions to the Earth grid lines then affecting the balance of life. In her vision she was shown the stone circle at Callanish, the Crown of Britain, with the energies locked, and saw that this was the most important site to bring back online. We learn also of the series of dreams and intuitions she had about

the Callanish stone circle and how to unlock its mysteries before she travelled there.

The author tells us of her journey to Callanish, and with two male companions was able to break the dark energies that had bound the site. Having completed their task before the solstice dawn, the author stands with her back to the central stone facing the sun as it rises, and shares with us her inner vision at the time. This is probably the most profound and magical part of the whole book as we learn that as the intensity of the sun increased, arcs of light connected each stone to a huge sphere of light spinning clockwise above the circle radiating out across the land. Then at sunset that evening, her inner vision sees a beautiful silver-blue vortex of light begin to spin anti-clockwise around the stones, focused downwards charging up a large blue energy sphere deep in the earth below the circle. This lunar sphere slowly spinning anti-clockwise interacts with the clockwise rotating solar sphere above, creating the double helix form of DNA, the source of all life.

In part 3 of the book the author returns again to the Callanish stone circle in 2016 to reconnect with the site and finish the work of recording the stones. The author is an accomplished photographer and artist, and one of the delights of the book are the stunning photographs that capture every aspect of the stone circle and its different moods. In part 4 we are given detailed photographs of every stone and drawings giving their relative position to each other.

This is a beautifully presented book that not only serves as a guide to this megalithic site, but gives meaning as to why it is there, and its purpose in relation to us and our planet Earth.
