March already - where did the last couple of months go?

As 2020 came to an end and we realised that we really would need to come up with more creative ways to keep in touch and maintain the momentum of our local dowsing community, the challenges of technology and organisation for an online world seemed overwhelming. In such a short time, it seems that we have become very much more au fait with "Zoom" and although we still experience the odd technical challenges, for the most part our ability to get together in this way has led to some very entertaining and interesting events.

Having given it some thought at the end of the year, the Committee suggested gathering twice a month with a formal talk on the second Tuesday and an informal get together on the fourth Tuesday.

At the time of writing, we have had two very successful talks with the first being on Dowsing and based on the talk that I gave in Whitminster Village Hall in January 2020 (who could have imagined then how the world would have changed in the intervening period).

I am delighted to report that the 12th January talk was attended by 82 people from as far afield as Yorkshire and the southern tip of Cornwall. This talk on Dowsing was updated to look at how our dowsing skills can help us to cope with the challenges of the global pandemic. I think that those who attended found it helpful to learn or to revisit some of the history and principles of dowsing and there was a lively Q&A session after the formal talk was over.

The second talk was entitled Re-enabling Kinship and was presented by Catriona Macdonald. I was introduced to Catriona by a friend last year and have attended her course on animal communications. The talk was both fascinating in the subject matter and extremely entertaining with Catriona presenting for just over an hour and finishing with a wonderful Heart Field practice meditation. Dowsing Tips

When using angle rods to dowse, the sensitivity of your response is partly governed by how you hold the rods. When holding the rods, gradually bring the far ends up until you reach the tipping point, where the rods swing back to you. The aim is to keep the rods just below the tipping point when dowsing for a response.

If you are dowsing for a yes/no response to a question and are standing or sitting still, then moving forward slightly can help to initiate a response. If you are fairly new to dowsing, always check the response before you start, by using 'show me yes' and 'show me no'.

Dowsing responses can vary from one hand to the other. For example your rods may cross when finding something underground, but your right hand rod, when used for a yes/no response on its own, may swing right for a yes and left for a no.

When dowsing, always keep your mind clear of any thoughts except for the thing you are dowsing for. Try to keep an emotive attitude of calm anticipation. If you try too hard, it can be counter productive to getting a result.
