Archaeological Dowsing Section of SDG



During dowsing for pre-history occupations at Old Down in Alveston, and knowing there had been some Roman occupation, a Roman road was indicated along the existing top path. John Wilson-Smith, a resident of Alveston, dowsed the line of the road on both sides of Old Down and continued to dowse for signs of occupation in the meadow.

His results indicated a large settlement of houses including a villa. The date dowses as being from late third to early fourth millenium. SDG previously visited John's Chapel Wood to dowse for the ruined Chapel and for earth energies.

On map of Old Down Roman buildings (*above***)**, farmers appear to have been at numbers marked 5–10 and 11–15. The villa is numbered 16. Soldiers/craftsmen appear to have been housed at numbers 22–32 with the senior soldiers in more spacious buildings at numbers 33–37. The Garrison camp is shown at number 38 in the field above the meadow.
