Slimbridge Dowsing Group Programme April 2015 to June 2015

Thursday 9th April **Dowsing Wells and Holes in the Ground** with John Baker*

John Baker is founder and Chairman of London Dowsers, the south-east's equivalent of Peter Golding. He has been a dowser for some 30 years, initially archaeological dowsing to gather proof that what he was dowsing actually existed (it did.) John still works with local archaeological groups, and saves them a lot of digging. In fact, he was successful to the point that the British Society of Dowsers (BSD) invited him to start a special interest group (SIG) in the subject. With help from Sue Brown, he Chaired the group for six years, served on the BSD Council but resigned after two years, and left the BSD four years ago.

Now concentrating on water divining, John set up the Professional Dowsers' Register to put some 'clear water' between the professional aspects of dowsing and the more esoteric aspects that have now taken



over the BSD. John is a great dowser and has some interesting tales to tell about wells, chalk mines, a medieval sewer, and on one memorable occasion, dead rats under the floorboards!

Thursday 9th April meeting followed by **Health & Wellbeing Group 4 p.m.** Future meetings will cover distant healing, dowsing Auras for health, dowsing food intolerances and appropriate homeopathic potency and dosage.



Saturday 25th April – Field Trip Archaeology at Hart's Barn

with Barry Goldring & Peter Gibson Hart's Barn is on the site of an eleventhcentury hunting lodge, reputedly built by William, Duke of Normandy. The adjacent buildings are used as a craft centre. We have been asked to fill in the 600-year archaeological gap between the first lodge and c. AD 1800.

Harts Barn is on the north side of the A4136 between Longhope and Mitcheldean.

Turn right through the second car park, and park behind the Workshop Units. Meet in Unit 18 for a briefing at 10.30 a.m. The tea rooms are open from 10 a.m.

If you would like lunch there, Emma has an offer for us - soup, big cheese scone and a cake for $\pounds 6.50$, and we have use of an upstairs room to ourselves. Thursday 14th May Healing with Crystal Light Grids and Sacred Geometry with Kelly Peacey*

- Visits sites where successful boreholes have been drilled on Peter's dowsing mark;

Archaeological Group Report by Andrew Pegg

Dowsing for a Blocked Drain

In January we received an SOS from a lady farmer in Stonehouse who had a blocked drain somewhere in one of her fields, and it was causing huge problems. Barry Goldring led a group of volunteers to see what they could do to help.

Barry had us dowse for any underground drains in the field, then marked out the lines of the two we found and where they joined. We discounted numerous energy spirals and an underground water course.

We then dowsed for the blockage which corresponded with a large boggy patch, so Barry marked out the blocked section with flags, and asked his rods the age and size of the pipes and their depth. We also dowsed whether the sections above and below were clear, which the rods indicated they were. You could see how the blockage was affecting the surrounding areas of the field.

The bonus opportunity after a much needed cup of tea in Sue's kitchen was to look at the ditches alongside the top end of field where the road runs. The ditch there was blocked and so full of water that it ran off from the adjoining large field on the other side of the road, over that, and into Sue's field. So it was a double whammy in terms of the cause of her boggy mess.

The low-cost option for Sue is to dig out and clear the specific section of drain which would then allow the water to flow to an outlet and ditch at the far end. If that is insufficient, then she might need to dig out the ditch on her western boundary to do the same job, but clearly that will be much more costly.

Clearing the blockage on the road to allow natural seepage seems out of her control and it is of no interest to the Highways Department to put in a drain, so this is definitely a low-cost self-help option. Sue was very pleased by our findings and suggestions of how to solve things.

Barry also gave us an impromptu session on 'advanced' dowsing involving wine selection and blinking, I think he said, so that was fantastic too.

Thank you, Barry, we learned a lot and it was well worth the trip to A&E to unfreeze the toes and lower limbs safely. That bit wasn't on the risk assessment. But apparently Barry did risk-assess the wind speed to see whether it might unduly affect our rods and the results. Clearly it did not! *Andrew Pegg BSc MRICS*
