Bio-Mimicry with Professor Hugh Barr*

'If one way be better than another, that you may be sure is Nature's way.' *Aristotle*.

Bio-Mimicry forms the basis of Medical Biomimetics – the imitation of nature to treat disease. During the last 3.6 billion years, nature has evolved through trial and error to refine the processes and materials of life. This emerging field has given rise to new technologies created from biologically-inspired engineering.

A perfect example is the photodynamic therapy used to treat cancer and other diseases, based on massive cell destruction during autumn. In ancient Greece, physicians could smell disease on the breath of patients. The human nose can detect malodour as a sign of malady.

The Wisdom of your Totem Animal with Celia Gunn*
